TEACHING

Current Teaching Responsibilities

Typically my teaching responsibilities include four elective courses, taken primarily by nursing students, in an academic year. The courses I teach generally have the family as its principal focus. Such courses have an appeal to nursing students in family and maternal care specialties and have recently grown in size of enrollment. The enrollment in these classes have ranged from six to 52 students, with a median of 16 students for each course.

At least two of my classes have ethnic minorities as their primary subject. These classes are among the few dealing with racial minorities on this entire campus. Other classes with a racial content have been approved, such as "Gender and Ethnicity" and "Aging and Ethnicity," and will be offered in the future.

The required course, "Socio-Cultural Variations in Health," is currently offered as an elective class during the fall quarter of each academic year. The purpose of this course is to examine variations in health attitudes among diverse racial groups in the United States. As the instructor, my role in this course is to establish its objectives, set forth a theoretical perspective, select readings, give lectures and to evaluate the students.

In the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences, my classes form the core for the study of the family. By defining the study of the family as a major elective speciality

within sociology, I hope to attract more doctoral students in this area.

RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITY

Current Research Program

My research program over a twenty-year period has consisted of the participant-observation of race relations in the United States, Africa, Latin America and the South Pacific. As an activist scholar I participated in and analyzed/interpreted the civil-rights movement of the 1960s for popular and scholarly periodicals, using the internal colonialism conceptual model developed by Frantz Fanon, Robert Blauner and others. During the 1970s, with the waning and redirection of Black liberation movements, my energies were focused on studying the Black and Latino family and sub-areas of that field of study. I published over five books between 1971-81 on the subject of Black family patterns, sex roles and changing trends in marital and sexual behavior.

As a student of the sociology of knowledge, I found myself constantly challenging and reinterpreting conventional theories on Black families in the scholarly literature. I decided to develop a different perspective that I called "Black Sociology." The book, published in 1976 by McGraw-Hill, remains the only systematic effort to interpret Black American life from an insider's perspective. Using a similar perspective I analyzed the changes in race relations between 1968-78 in another book, "The Urban Plantation, Racism and Colonialism in the Post-civil Rights Era." The book, published by the Black Scholar Press in 1987, represents my most recent theoretical formulations on American race relations over a twenty-year period. These views have currency in a wide variety of audiences as I receive more than one hundred invitations to give lectures each year before scholarly and lay groups.

For the last ten years my research program has consisted of crosscultural studies in the South Pacific. Specifically, I have been using participant observation methods to compare the situation of Aboriginals in Australia, Maoris in New Zealand and Black Americans and Native Americans in the United States. The empirical data have been used to illustrate theoretical formulations developed on my initial visit to the South Pacific in 1982. At that time I discovered unique commonalities between the indigenous groups of Australia and New Zealand with Native Americans and Black Americans in the United States. On the basis of those observations I refined the concept of "The Fourth World" to include a nonindigenous group-Black Americans. The fourth world is defined as those nonwhite

peoples occupying minority status in white settler nations. My investigation has centered around the outcome of white settler values imposed on indigenous peoples or groups that had an involuntary entry into such societies. Several articles containing preliminary findings have been published in Australia, New Zealand and the United States.
